Creativity transcends ableism





- Ableism is the discrimination of and social justice against people with disabilities based on the belief that typical abilities are superior
 - At its heart ableism is rooted in the assumptions that message disabled people require 'fixing' and defines people by their disability
- Like racism and sexism, ableism classifies entire groups of people "less than", and includes harmful stereotypes, misconceptions, and generalisations of people with disabilities
